## Review of Oswald and the CIA Juxtaposed with James Wilcott House Select Committee on Assassinations Testimony

On January 31, 2000 I wrote a review of Professor John Newman's 1995 book *Oswald and the CIA*, In my review I stated that in his book Newman sought to demonstrate there was no proof that Lee Harvey Oswald had been a CIA agent.
