



In your testimony before the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence on August 3, 1977 you stated that you would work with the Attorney General and the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to locate individuals who had been subjects of behavioral control experiments by the CIA in order to determine if they required medical assistance as a result of their participation in these experiments.
