In 1977 the Director of Central Intelligence made a commitment to Congress to make every effort to identify, locate, and inform persons who may have been involved in CIA supported drug testing activities without their knowledge or informed consent. Some evidence and testimony has been obtained which indicates a person with your name may have been so involved.

If you are the correct person, a determination of which I should be able to make in a brief telephone conversation, we wish to furnish you the few details of your involvement in our possession. If you are not the correct [Redacted] and this is an instance of mistaken identity, we wish to redirect our search. Please phone me at your earliest convenience during East Coast office hours. A collect call will be accepted. I may be reached by phone at [Redacted] or, if you prefer, by mail at the above address.
